GAMMA-RHO ZETA ANNOUNCES \$1.5 MILLION CAMPAIGN TO UPDATE CHAPTER HOUSE Over \$825,000 Committed from Loyal Brothers

For the past 80 years, more than 2,200 men have called 904 College home and had the honor of being Lambda Chis while attending the University of Oklahoma. AXA members have a long history of leadership on campus, in the classroom, in intramurals, and as alumni. Our Chapter House has served us well and has been the centerpiece of life as a Lambda Chi at the University of Oklahoma.

Our house is now over 80 years old and has only undergone one renovation since its construction in 1929. It is in serious need of updating to meet the requirements of today's modern students. To remain the top fraternity at the University of Oklahoma, it is essential that Gamma-Rho Zeta provide a safe, comfortable, and attractive home to our undergraduate members that can compete with other fraternities and off-campus housing.

Gamma-Rho Zeta proudly announces the *Building on Our Tradition* of *Excellence* campaign. Our renovation plans focus on the second and third floor residence halls, which will be gutted and rebuilt with new electrical service and computer connections, plumbing, and fire suppression systems. Common areas including the basement, housemother's apartment, anterooms to the dining hall, and kitchen will also be remodeled. Should there be additional support beyond our \$1.5 million goal, our plans call for exterior enhancement and new construction where building codes allow and a separate parking facility. We recognize that Gamma-Rho Zeta would not have its history of campus prominence without the loyal support of its alumni. Many enthusiastic brothers have stepped forward and made early personal commitments totaling over \$825,000 to this vital project. While this is a great beginning, we need your help to reach our \$1.5 million goal.

In the coming weeks, you will receive additional information detailing the project and ways you can help. We hope you will join our growing list of supporters who wish to ensure the lasting impact of the Lambda Chi Alpha Fraternity brotherhood on the lives of undergraduate men at the University of Oklahoma. Alumni who came before us provided the opportunity to join ΛXA , to live in the Chapter House, and to develop the enduring friendships we enjoy. Now is the time to join your brothers to provide the same unique experience to future generations.

hen **Dr. Ron Elkins**, **ΓP 393** entered the doors of Λ XA, at the

> nate to the *Building on Our Tradition of Excellence: The Campaign for Gamma-Rho.* "The previous major addition and renovation [to the Chapter House] was when I was in school. I was treasurer of the Fraternity when we signed the loan note to begin construction." That was 1957, and Ron knows the house must be brought up to present standards.

Aside from the obvious structural needs of the Chapter House, Ron feels a connection to those brothers who have passed through the halls before him. Becoming part of a fraternity like Λ XA is an opportunity Ron

feels others could benefit from. "Allowing members of AXA to have an environment for academic and social development in a safe, modern environment is important." Ron goes on to say, "The maturation and development that occurred during my undergraduate days contributed, in many ways, to my success." Ron wants to ensure as many men as possible have the same opportunities he did.

Ron is a semi-retired physician and remains on the faculty of the Oklahoma Health Sciences Center, College of Medicine. When he has some free time, he spends it fishing, hunting, shooting, farming, and, most importantly, "raising and spoiling my grandchildren." Ron and his wife, Lida, reside in Oklahoma City.

brothers heard of the *Building on Our Tradition of Excellence* campaign, they jumped at the opportunity to invest in the future of Lambda Chi Alpha. On April 4, 2011, Matt and his brothers pledged \$190,000 to the project, a rare action taken by most undergraduates.

The driving force behind the class decision to make a pledge was based on pride. The undergraduates want

to show their dedication to the Chapter, much like the classes before them. "Our class was excited to have the opportunity to be involved in a way that would impact the Chapter well into the future," said Matt. He and his brothers believe their contributions will help preserve the past of Λ XA and position the Chapter to continue its leadership role on the OU campus and in the Norman community for years to come.

Matt will be graduating in May 2013. His time in Λ XA has taught him to try new things, take advantage of opportunities, and to have a

The purpose of the undergraduates is to show their commitment to the Chapter that is providing them with so much, even if they won't get to reap the benefits of living in a new house. alumni to fund this campaign alone," Matt said. "We are committed to this campaign and hope our alumni will be as well. We look forward to watching the joint effort of alumni and active members result in something we can all be proud of."

For the silver anniversary, we brought in Gamma-Rho's own Matt Hamilton, **FP 1168** to judge the pageant, while another Gamma-Rho alumnus, Adam Clinton, **FP** 1582, hosted the event. We were able to raise over \$6,000 to benefit the Big Brothers Big Sisters program. Just five days later we held our Swishes for Wishes event, which is a basketball tournament philanthropy that Lambda Chi co-hosted with the women of Chi Omega. With this event, we were able to raise an impressive \$4,000 for the Make-A-Wish Foundation. All together, the men of Lambda Chi were able to raise over \$10,000 in five days, benefitting two great philanthropies.
