## CONSTRUCTION UNDERWAY AT GAMMA-RHO ZETA

### *Campaign Goal Increased to \$3 Million to Accommodate Rising Construction Costs*

Construction is underway at Gamma-Rho Zeta Chapter! Work began in the basement this winter and then moved to the first, second, and third floors in December after the active brothers vacated the house for winter break.

#### FIRST FLOOR RENOVATION

Our initial plans did not include much remodeling of the first floor. However, the discovery of asbestos required that we gut it as well to ensure we are providing our collegians with a safe living environment. We are still on timeline, though, and demolition of the second and third floors is complete. A wall has been removed in the basement to make the two south rooms one large living area. We have begun framing the handicapped suite on the first floor as well as the ladies' powder room. We do not currently have any handicapped members, so for now the suite will be designated for the High Alpha. We have removed the back stairway from the first floor and have gained quite a bit of space as a result.

The rooms upstairs have been reconfigured to better utilize our space, and we will still be able to accommodate 64 members. The outside looks like a war zone. There are fire escapes that extend from the building, and the concrete base has been poured. We are always eager to visit the site to see what other exciting progress has been made!

#### CAMPAIGN GOAL TO INCREASE

We are so grateful to the 277 alumni who have contributed to the *Building on Our Tradition of Excellence* campaign who have enabled this project to become a reality. Without your gifts of support, we would not have been able to begin this essential renovation. However, our project budget did not allot for the unforeseen costs associated with the first floor asbestos discovery—which added a whopping \$87,000 to our expenses. Construction bids have come back higher than originally quoted and costs for furniture and landscaping have not been factored into our overall budget. As a result, the campaign leadership feels it is absolutely necessary that we increase our campaign goal to \$3 million. Doing so will allow us to avoid burdening our

undergraduate members with additional debt and offset the added expenses from the first floor renovation.

We need to fulfill 100% of this matching challenge by our deadline of December 31 to keep our project on schedule and on budget. To date, our total amount raised stands at \$1,388,714.

## Conrad Masterson, GP 581, Gives Back to Gamma-Rho Zeta Campaign, Says Renovation Is Desperately Needed

**C**onrad Masterson, GP 581, joined the Gamma-Rho Zeta of Lambda Chi Alpha with his high school friends Roger Clapp, GP 580 and Joel Contreras, GP 595 “We didn’t join as a group, but we had a good, common feel in what we saw in Lambda Chi,” Conrad said.

Conrad has stayed in touch with many of his fraternity brothers who were in the Chapter when he was a member, as well as younger members. “I have a brother-in-law who is a Lambda Chi from Arkansas and two friends in my church who are Lambda Chis from West Texas A&M.” Thirty years ago Conrad was introduced to Raymond Foster, GP 1151. “Even though Raymond has lived overseas as a missionary for Cru ever since we met, we’re close friends,” Conrad said. “These are neat connections that didn’t happen when I was on campus but years later. It’s fun to realize that you have that bond that is broader than the time you were at OU.”

Conrad and his wife, Ellen, live on the Open RX Ranch near Cee Vee, Texas, in the southern rolling plains. The ranch is a small place and named for Conrad’s family brand used in Oklahoma on their ranch near Purcell, an area settled by Conrad’s paternal grandfather before Oklahoma became a state. Prior to retiring to the ranch, Conrad spent a number of years with telecommunications and computer startups after beginning his career at Ford Motor Company in corporate finance.

When Conrad first heard about the *Building on Our Tradition of Excellence* campaign, he knew he wanted to give back to Gamma-Rho Zeta. “I just jumped in right away,” he said. “I thought it was a great opportunity, and I wish more people would give to a greater level, but I am pleased we have been able to raise as much as we have. I think if brothers would set up a donation on an automatic check at their bank, they would see how easy it is to make a significant contribution without it being a big hit to their budget. For less than \$17 a month, that’s one Big Mac a week, you can give \$1,000 in five years. For \$85 a month, you can give \$5,000 in five years.”

Conrad knows that the state of the Chapter House is very important to potential new members and that it’s important the house looks in top condition for recruitment purposes. “The house desperately needs to be upgraded,” he said. “It looked like a low-income housing project before

the renovations started, and it needed to be fixed. Top quality guys have lots of choices for joining a fraternity. It makes it a whole lot easier to recruit the best when you have the best facilities.”

In his free time Conrad enjoys fly fishing, traveling internationally with Ellen, and staying involved in non-profit organizations in Dallas and Houston. Conrad is also interested in ranch history and recently donated his collection of first edition western ranch history books to the library at OU.
