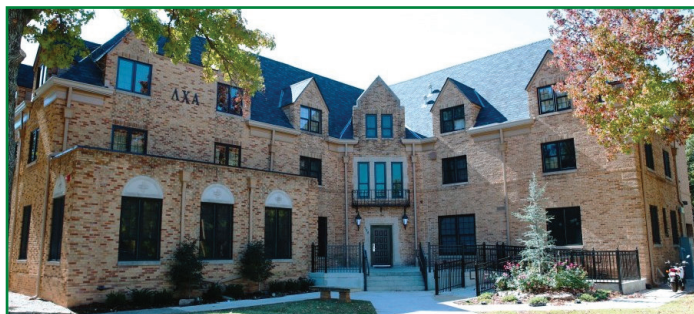

Ensuring Your Investment of 904 College

The remodel and transformation of 904 College has created a new sense of pride in the home of Lambda Chi Alpha at the University of Oklahoma shared among all of our alumni and collegiate brothers. With this new sense of pride comes a new responsibility to ensure that our home maintains its newness as long as possible. Our house corporation, SP Holding, began new operating procedures this past year and was very successful in our transition from the first year back in the house to this year.

The Chapter, too, has made changes in order to keep the house looking new and fresh. We are working together as stewards of the home.

Here are some of the ways we are ensuring the future of your investment of 904 College.

- The Chapter itself has pledged (and is paying) a large amount toward the renovation, which gives them ownership in the remodel.
- The Chapter maintains a line item in their budget for repairs and upkeep of the house.
- A \$500 damage/security deposit is required of each member living in the house.
- End-of-year cleanup and damage repairs come from the deposits accordingly.
- A representative from SP Holding inspects the house at the beginning and end of each year. He will make recommendations for each room, as well as common areas.
- SP has reviewed and increased our property coverage to \$3.3 million and will monitor and review the insurance on an annual basis.
