

A Time of Transition: Call for Alumni Volunteers

This summer marks the end of an era at 904 College. After serving as Gamma-Rho's Chapter adviser for 20 years, **Rodger Lalli, FP 1894** has retired from the High Pi position. We can never repay or thank Rodger enough for his dedication to Gamma-Rho. He has mentored hundreds of our brothers who have passed through the doors of 904 College. He has helped shape them into the men they are today. The values he instilled in them have helped build upon a Chapter legacy that all of us can be proud of. Unsurprising to those who know him, Rodger does not seek recognition for his service, nor does he even want this article to focus on him as much as it has already. Suffice it to say, though: thank you, Rodger, for all you have done for us.

Instead of dwelling on the past, however, both Rodger and the Gamma-Rho Alumni Association hope that this time of change will inspire even more of our alumni brothers to pick up the lamp and lead our Chapter into the future. Rodger's retirement is the latest in a series of longtime alumni volunteers stepping down so that others may step up. Reflecting Faith, Hope, and Love


Tim Holt, GP 1173 Reflects on His ΛXA Years and Future
